Our Little School has Grown!



Chapel Field East Africa is growing to capacity. About 30 students come during the day, and 30 more in the evening for tutoring.

The Growing Need

Since we opened our school and have fed our students what little we can, street children have been gravitating to us for meals and schooling. Police bring us the children arrested for stealing food and scavenging dumpsters rather than putting them in child prison where conditions are very bad. We cannot turn them away.

We have purchased some cooking equipment and increased our food budget to help these children. We do not want to become an orphanage but we must treat these children as God would have us.

Two street children whom authorities turned over to us are being welcomed by two of our students.

Two boys pictured below and a girl, Rose Ndinidi (not pictured), were orphans - not going to school, sleeping in the streets, and without food and clothing. Matthew 25 has provided them with a home, clothing, a daily meal, and a paid semester at a private high school. Stephen reports all three are now excelling with grade averages of B+.





The mission field has come to us! Over 75 students from China visited our campus from mid July to mid August. They entered a special academic ESL and cultural program we call JAY-ICE (Join American Youth in Christian Education.)

The boys and girls, aged 12-16, stayed with Chapel Field host families. Each morning at school they attended chapel specially designed to present the Gospel. The students also attended church with their host families, and went on several cultural trips each week.

At a closing program, each student received many souvenirs and a Chinese-English Bible to take home. Email addresses were gathered so we can follow up on each student.

When they depart, there is much crying, "We want to stay another week." Emotions run high, and all students, faculty, and staff involved are grateful to God for this wonderful opportunity.

Partnership Schools

Chapel Field now has three partnership schools in China- One in Shenzhen near Hong Kong, another in Weifang in the Shandong Province, and another located in the city of Xuzhou in the Jiangsu province.

Almost 100 million students graduate from Chinese high schools each year! Only 1 or 2 percent can get into the best Chinese universities. Under our dual credit program, Chapel Field teaches portions of the New York State curriculum in the partnership school, then issues a Chapel Field diploma and sends transcripts to American Universities.
